



Savannah Resources PLC (“Savannah”) is a mineral exploration company listed on the London AIM stock exchange (AIM: SAV) and is developing a lithium project in the Barroso region, which is the subject of these newsletters. Savannah’s main goal is to provide the communities surrounding the project with information about the work completed and planned, so that the community is involved in this project so important for everyone.

November at Mina do Barroso

Savannah is currently concentrating on finalizing the Environmental Impact Study (EIA), which will be delivered to APA (Portuguese Environment Agency) early next year. The finalization of the EIA will enable us to provide a comprehensive, facted-based assessment of the project prepared by leading consulting industry professionals. It will help answer the questions that have been posed to us, over the time we have been conducting research and prospecting, related to possible environmental impacts and their mitigation.

As part of our ongoing environmental monitoring programme we monitor the Covas River with water collection and groundwater level measurements. This monitoring allows us to characterize the current situation and seasonal variation of groundwater in the concession area (C-100).

Additionally, Savannah annually submits a monitoring report to comply with the Environmental Impact Statement (DIA), for which soil samples have been collected from “parga” into Alto do Misarela (pargas are the areas of humus soils). This sampling serves to characterize the quality of these soils. During November drilling surveys were also conducted to support the economic characterization of the deposits to be mined for- spodumene, quartz, feldspar and bulk pegmatite.

The EIA will be presented to APA as a comprehensive study, a format that allows this organization, in additional consultation with the various stakeholders, to make the decision and advise on the options presented by us, always having as main concern the best possible integration of the project in the area where it is being implemented.

Mining operations continued at Alto da Misarela (NOA) on the C100 mining lease. In accordance with government regulations and our safety policy this area is fenced and locked and we would ask that this aspect is respected by the population.

In November we had the visit of the Secretary of State for Energy, João Galamba, together the Mayor Of Boticas, Fernando Eirão Queiroga, visited our Information Center in Covas do Barroso and were briefed on the project whereupon the party visited the concession area where the Secretary of State spoke with interested members of the the local community.



We are offering the community the opportunity to make a supervised visit to the mine by appointment. This can be arranged at the Information Center or via our dedicated community email of community@savannahresources.com. However, we will start these visits only in January, as Savannah will have fewer employees during the holiday season, making it impossible to offer this service.

We remind you that our **Information Center in Covas do Barroso** is open every Tuesday from 10am to 12.30pm and Wednesdays from 3pm to 5.30pm. However, on **December 24, 25 and 31, and January 1, it will be closed for our employees' holidays.**
