Savannah Resources PLC ("Savannah") is a mineral exploration company listed on the London AIM stock exchange (AIM: SAV) and is developing a lithium project in Barroso region, on which issue we make these newsletters. Savannah's main goal is to provide the communities surrounding the project with information about the work completed and planned, so that the community is involved in this project so important for everyone.

August and September at Mina do Barroso

On the 14th of August took place in Covas do Barroso, the Public Meeting of explanations to the population.

Savannah presented what has been happening in the project and what is planned for the concession area: exploration cores, landfills of inert waste, mineral treatment and development support infrastructures, connecting roads between different cores and outflow of the final product (spodumena concentrate).

The audience had the opportunity to ask their questions, which deserved our greatest attention. The Environmental Impact Study is still under development and Savannah will share findings and developments with all stakeholders as soon as we have relevant information.



We take advantage of this newsletter to provide some clarification that will be of general interest.

What is an Environmental Impact Study and why is it done?

Portuguese law requires companies to assess the impact of their activity in order to ensure that the quality of life of the populations and the environment are preserved. Law Decree 151-B / 2013 of 31 October initially established the Environmental Impact Assessment Legal Regime (RJAIA) and has been updated over the years, which requires companies to carry out the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA). The EIA is a document prepared by the proposer, in this case Savannah, which contains: a brief description of the project; identification and assessment of the probable impacts, positive and negative, that the project's realization may have on the environment; predictable evolution of the situation

without the project; environmental management measures designed to prevent, minimize or compensate for expected negative impacts; non-technical summary of this information.

Who perfoms the Environmental Impact Study?

Performing the EIA is the sole responsibility of the proposing company, in this case Savannah. Savannah, for its social responsibility and respect for the environment, has decided to turn to an outside company for support. Our EIA is being developed by VISA Consultores, a company with broad experience in the mining sector.

In this way, we are able to ensure that its development is being carried out by a multidisciplinary team, covering all the specialties established by the legislation, and that all analyzes inherent to the work are performed by certified laboratories. We want to ensure that results are valid and reliable.

What works have been done?

Fieldwork has focused on the study of fauna, flora, surface and groundwater quality, soil quality, noise and air quality.

What is the purpose of these works?

Field works are developed with the objective of characterizing the reference situation (current situation without mine). With the beginning of the project, systematic evaluations will be made, whose values will be compared with the initial ones (values obtained in the characterization of the reference situation), from this information crossing we will be able to conclude about the interference degree of mining activity with the environment.
