



Savannah Resources PLC (“Savannah”) is a mineral exploration company listed on the London AIM stock exchange (AIM: SAV) and is developing a lithium project in the Barroso region, which is the subject of these newsletters. Savannah’s main goal is to provide the communities surrounding the project with a regular flow of information on work underway and planned. The Mina do Barroso Project will bring exceptional economic, demographic, social and business opportunities to the Barroso region while at the same time implementing world’s best environmental management practices.

## December and January at Mina do Barroso

Savannah remains focused on developing the work required to complete the Environmental Impact Study (EIA). The process of completing the EIA is taking longer than originally anticipated as we were recently advised of a requirement to broaden the scope of the EIA and assess the Project’s significance and implications for Spain.

In this sense, the evaluation of groundwater in the Mining Lease area has been carried out, in addition to the treatment and analysis of collected data that allow studies to be included in this document for delivery to the Portuguese Environment Agency (APA). This work will continue in the month of February, during which we will also make a water harvest in Alto da Misarela on the C-100 Mining Lease, where we currently mine quartz and feldspar, in order to comply with ongoing environmental monitoring requirements as established by the DIA (Declaration of Environmental Impact).

During the month of January we repaired two areas of an access road on the Mining Lease damaged by recent heavy rains. In addition, and at the request of the owner of one of the plots of land where we have rights of access, we carried out some clearing activities to assist with land boundary determinations.

Given the growing interest of the media in the subject of lithium in Portugal, Savannah, like the community and other interested parties, has been approached by several journalists requesting information about the project.

On January 27, we received two journalists who accompanied us to the Community Information Center in Covas do Barroso for a comprehensive briefing on the Project, followed by a visit to the Grandão area (Fechas), where we are undertaking evaluations.



Savannah is has an ongoing programme of engaging with landowners around land acquisitions in the C-100 Mining Lease area. During December and January, contacts were made with several members of the community to proceed with the identification of owners, boundaries and areas of the various plots. This programme will continue over coming months.

Savannah is developing a Benefits Sharing Programme that we will introduce to the community once completed. It will outline a Plan that will provide benefits not only directly to residents of the villages of Covas do Barroso, Romainho and Muro but also to surrounding areas.
