



Savannah Resources PLC (“Savannah”) is a mineral exploration company listed on the London AIM stock exchange (AIM: SAV) and is developing a lithium project in the Barroso region, which is the subject of these newsletters. Savannah’s main goal is to provide the communities surrounding the project with a regular flow of information on work underway and planned. The Mina do Barroso Project will bring exceptional economic, demographic, social and business opportunities to the Barroso region while at the same time implementing world’s best environmental management practices.

Environmental Impact Study and Socioeconomic Study

A comprehensive Environmental Impact Study (EIA) supplemented by a Mining Plan (MP) of Mina do Barroso were delivered to the Portuguese Environment Agency (APA) and to the Directorate-General for Energy and Geology (DGEG) on the 1st of June. A preliminary analysis of the studies has been made by these entities resulting in a request for additional information addressed to Savannah. Our team, supported by several expert, independent environmental consultants who developed the study, is committed to working on the collection of the requested additional information that needs to be presented to APA. Once APA is satisfied with the information we anticipate that the EIA will then go to public consultation. The EIA will provide stakeholders with facts based information for their consideration. Savannah will be holding a series of public subject matter workshops to help stakeholders’ understanding. The workshops are planned to be held in Covas do Barroso and Boticas.

The objective of the EIA was to detail all aspects of the mine and especially the well-being of the community and care for the environment. With a special focus on people, local traditions, the rural nature of the region, the importance of agriculture, water and air quality, measures were presented to eliminate, minimize or compensate for possible impacts, ensuring the continuity and development of the community and life in the region.

We asked to the Minho University for a comprehensive and independent study on the socio-economic impact of Mina do Barroso. The study represents our continued cooperation and transparency with the local community, as we believe that this project is well structured, with strict environmental management and with real benefits for the region.

This work was developed by professors João Cerejeira and Francisco Carballo-Cruz, and is available for consultation on the Mina do Barroso website (www.minadobarroso.com), by all interested parties. The preparation of the study was based on economic data from the region and on the analysis and projection of the economic and social impact that Mina do Barroso project. Its conclusions confirm Savannah's expectations regarding the importance of the project for the Boticas region, namely with regard to increasing employment, creating new businesses, developing existing businesses, promoting local products, increasing tourism, while bringing more young people to the region, which will ensure higher incomes and a consequent improvement in the life of the local population as a whole. The economic value of Mina do Barroso will be an extremely important support also for the economic recovery of Portugal, in a phase as complicated as the one we are experiencing, due to Covid-19.

As the current restrictions caused by the Covid-19 pandemic have been easing, Savannah has maintained, with all precautions, the ongoing environmental monitoring of the C-100 concession area, with regard to noise, quality air and vibrations.

We have resumed the engagement program with the landowners, following the necessary protection and detachment rules, being fully available to visit and evaluate the properties or to clarify any issue through our usual contacts.

We continue to develop the Benefit Sharing Program, which is one of our main commitments to stakeholders, Mayor of Boticas, Community, Baldios CdB, CdB Parish Council and everyone involved. It will soon be presented, together with proposed compensations and elimination and/or mitigation measures.

We are pleased that the Boticas region remains free of cases of Covid-19 and we wish that everyone remains safe and healthy, without the appearance of any cases. We reinforce that we remain available for any support that is necessary and within reach.
