December & January at Mina do Barroso

We want to reinforce to all stakeholders, especially the local communities, that Mina do Barroso means commitment, development, sustainability, environmental protection and real benefits for the communities.

It was in this sense that, last December, we promoted an online session, in webinar format, dedicated to the theme “Responsible and Sustainable Mining: an Opportunity called Lithium”, the recording of which is available on our website: www.minadobarroso.com.

This is what we defend daily. Exemplary good environmental practices worldwide, energy efficiency, reducing the environmental footprint and eliminating or mitigating any environmental and social impacts at all stages of the operation. At the economic level, the jobs created and the dynamism instilled are synonymous with the growth and development of a region to which Mina do Barroso belongs and that Savannah wants to support.

We believe that this is a project that stands out for its difference and commitment, which was reinforced with the announcement of the agreement for the development of a strategic partnership with Galp Energia, at the beginning of January. This agreement provides for the investment of approximately 5.2 million euros from Galp in the acquisition of 10% of Savannah Lithium, and the possibility of selling 100,000 tons per year of the Spodumene concentrate from Mina do Barroso.

Regarding the communities of Covas do Barroso and Dornelas, they will always be a priority for Savannah, so we intend to maintain an open involvement, listening to them and transmitting all information clearly, communicating facts that promote trust and reinforce our commitment, for which we have our hotlines always available.

In this sense, since the beginning of December, and with the aim of clarifying several questions and concerns of the local community about the exploration project of Mina do Barroso, we launched the “Mina do Barroso in a Minute” program and several articles, which have been broadcast especially in the local media.

The aim is to make it clear that the Barroso Mine project offers numerous benefits for the Boticas region, from creating jobs to promoting local traditions and products, through investments for the protection and rehabilitation of fauna and flora, as well as implementing a benefit-sharing plan for local communities.

During the month of December, a study on the Iberian wolf was also carried out, at the request of the ICNF, given that it is a protected species. It is demonstrated that the Barroso Mine project will have no impact on this species, as it will also contribute to its sustainability, protecting it from poachers and supporting local shepherds in protecting their flocks, through a program developed for this purpose with based on technical

advice and the collaboration of Grupo Lobo, CE3C of the Faculty of Sciences and the Forestry Association of Trás-os-Montes (AFTM).

The comprehensive Environmental Impact Study (EIA) remains under assessment by the regulatory body, Portuguese Environment Agency (APA), after which it will be placed in public consultation by this same body. We look forward to presenting the Benefit Sharing Program soon, which is one of our main commitments to local communities.

Despite the complicated situation that we are currently experiencing in our country, with the high and worrying number of cases in Covid-19 also in the municipality of Boticas, we wish that everyone remains safe and healthy, without major complications. We reinforce that Savannah is fully available for any support that is needed.
