



Savannah Resources PLC (“Savannah”) is a mineral exploration company listed on the London AIM stock exchange (AIM: SAV) and is developing a lithium project in the Barroso region, which is the subject of these newsletters. Savannah’s main goal is to provide the communities surrounding the project with a regular flow of information on work underway and planned. The Mina do Barroso Project will bring exceptional economic, demographic, social and business opportunities to the Barroso region while at the same time implementing industry leading environmental management practices.

May at Mina do Barroso

In May, the Portuguese Environment Agency (APA) organized two clarification sessions to debate the Environmental Impact Study (EIA) for the Mina do Barroso. As part of the public hearing, these sessions aimed to provide information, gather opinions and suggestions, as well as clarify doubts.

The first meeting was held in digital format and was attended by over a hundred participants, among various stakeholders, namely members of the local community. The second session was in person, only for entities invited by the APA, and took place in Boticas.

In both sessions, most of the issues presented were related to themes that have been addressed by Savannah, either through the EIA, or in its communication materials. To present the various phases of the project, from its beginning to the end of exploration, as well as the planned mitigation measures and the answers to the various questions presented, the public debates had the participation of the company that coordinated the execution of the EIA, Visa Consultants.

Following the second clarification session, which took place in Boticas, the Evaluation Committee took the opportunity to carry out the usual visit to the project, an action planned during the Environmental Impact Assessment period. The site visit fulfilled the objective of demonstrating to the Evaluation Committee how the entire project was designed and how it will be adapted to the local reality.

The debriefing sessions allowed Savannah to reaffirm its commitment to developing a sustainable and responsible project that creates value for the region and its communities.

The Environmental Impact Study will remain in public consultation until the next 16th of July, according to the latest communication from the APA. After the public debate, the Portuguese Environment Agency should issue an opinion, based on the results of the public consultation and the analysis of the Evaluation Committee. If

there are no delays, Savannah expects a result during the second half of 2021. Depending on the results of the EIA, construction is expected to start in 2022, with the aim of reaching commercial production in 2023.

On May 19, Savannah reopened the Community Information Center, in Covas do Barroso, with a novelty: a 3D model of the project. This model allows a better visualization of how the project will be built and how it will be implemented on site, giving a closer perspective of reality. Since the project is still in the preliminary study phase, the model can be adapted to the possible necessary changes, with three alternative options, and, if approved, other changes may be proposed.
